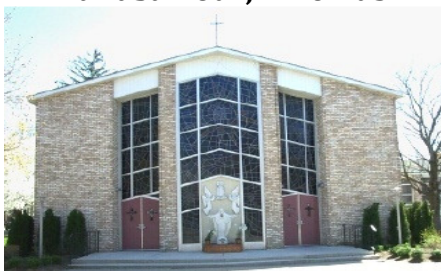

THE KINGDOM OF GOD

The kingdom of God is at the very centerpiece of Jesus' teachings. This expression is found in 122 separate sayings in the New Testament and was referred to 90 of those times by Jesus. Many of the gospel parables begin with the words "The kingdom of God is like..." In fact Jesus said our primary focus in life was to "seek first the kingdom of God...(Matthew 6:33). We first encounter this phrase in the preaching of John the Baptist who said, "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. When Jesus begins His ministry He too begins by preaching "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand (Matt 4:17). Both simply announce that the kingdom of God is "at hand". The Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) are important in helping us understand what the believers of the God of Israel (Jews) understood about the kingdom of God and why they also had some very serious misunderstandings about the nature of the kingdom of God.

What then do the Hebrew Scriptures have to say about the kingdom of God? God chose to rule His world through an earthly king. In 2 Chronicles 20:6: "*O Lord, God of our fathers... You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. In your hand are power and might, so that none is able to withstand you.*" While it is true that God alone is the ultimate king of Israel and over all of creation, human kings have a key role to play in God's kingdom. In fact, God built human kingship into creation itself. In Genesis 1:26 Adam is clearly portrayed as a king: *Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.* In short, Adam is to rule over the whole world as a subordinate king underneath God, the true king over all. He is to spread God's own dominion outside the boundaries of the Garden of Eden. Adam, of course, fails to take dominion over the earth.

Despite Adam's sin and failure God does not abandon His intention to rule over the earth through a human king. Saul, Israel's first king, does not rule according to the Lord's command (1 Sam 15) and it is at this point that David is anointed king and that culminates in the covenant God makes with David (1 Sam 16). In this covenant God promises to preserve a kingly line into the future.

The kingdom of God seems close to disappearing as Israel (the ten northern tribes) and then Judah, are carried off into exile (Israel in 722 BC) (2 Kings 17: 6:23) and Judah in 586 BC). The prophets however, make it clear that even with the exile God would not, and did not abandon His intention to rule over His people and His world through a Davidic king. Is 40:9-11: *Behold, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him.* and Dan 2:44: *And in the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that shall never be destroyed*

What the religious leaders of Israel had lost however was the spiritual nature of the kingdom of God. We must therefore turn to the Gospels to see what Jesus has to say about the nature of the kingdom of God.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that he Lord is a "merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

Gospel: John 3:16-18

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he "gave his only son." Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.
