

The Book Discussion of Adult Faith Formation – Holy Longing

The Adult Faith Formation in Infant Saviour whose mission is to strengthen the ongoing spiritual formation of the adults began another book discussion on the spiritual book; Holy Longing: The Search for a Christian Spirituality. This book discussion is conducted by Dr. Richard Reich and Fr. Rodrigo.

The ministry of the Adult Faith Formation needs to engage the particular interests and needs of the adults in each community of faith. It usually offers comprehensive and systematic presentations of the core elements of Catholic faith and practices. This ministry helps Christians to form a Christian conscience and to live their lives in the world as faithful disciples of Jesus. The educational sessions of Adult Faith Formation are meant to address the needs of those Catholics who are seeking to deepen their faith. They also provide a deeper understanding and vision of adulthood today in the twenty-first century.

Once Pope Francis mentioned that the healing ministry of Christ is one of the key aspects of Hs ministry, which is not often emphasized. Pope Francis makes the healing ministry of Christ as the essence of the Gospel when he said that the task of the Church is not to make moral and dogmatic pronouncement, but to heal the wounds and touch the hearts of people. All of us need healing at one time or the other; some from physical disease, others from spiritual and psychological wounds, and other from everything; physical, psychological, and spiritual.

In a time when Christianity often feels remote from everyday life and the Church membership is in radical decline, Fr. Ronald Rolheiser, O.M.I., Ph.D. who authored *Holy Longing: The Search for a Christian Spirituality* has done an immense service for all Christians to understand how important our Christian spirituality. *Holy Longing* is a work that can be enlightening to read for anyone along their vocational journey. Fr. Rolheiser states that in order to understand one's Christian call, he/she first needs to be in touch with all aspects of one's spirituality. One of the reasons is that within our spirituality is an energy acting as a compass to guide us towards the will of God. Fr. Rolheiser guides the reader to develop an awareness and listening ear to her/his spirituality.

Born in Canada, Fr. Rolheiser belongs to the order of *Oblates of Mary Immaculate (O.M.I.)*. He did his undergraduate work in theology at Newman Theological College in Edmonton in Canada and in the University of San Francisco in the early 1970s. Then, he followed up with a master's and a doctorate from the University of Louvain in Belgium in the early 1980s. At the age of 69, Fr. Rolheiser has become one of the most popular Canadian writers and speakers on Catholic spirituality. *Holy Longing* became his most successful book and sold more than 200,000 copies in 1999. The secret to the success of *The Holy Longing* is that it offers a basic guide to today's sprawling wilderness of spiritual resources.

In *Holy Longing* shows a contemporary path to a healthy and an authentic spiritual life. Also, by channeling the deep, mysterious desires of our hearts, it leads readers from restlessness to peace. In speaking of the catholic spiritual tradition, Fr. Rolheiser said, "The good news is that the Catholic spiritual tradition contains a unique set of resources for channeling those longings in healthy directions."

While Christ needs to be the center (central) of any Christian spirituality, the central mystery of Christian spirituality is the mystery of incarnation. Based on this mystery, Fr. Rolheiser makes a wonderful point in conclusion noting that we must not think incarnation as something took place in ancient history, but, that which is ongoing and real. Fr. Niranjan Rodrigo, Ph.D



Let your New York State Senators know this is going too far----

In his annual budget, Governor Cuomo included a radical bill (S.7511) that would eliminate virtually all limitations on abortion in New York State. It would ensure that abortion is legal through all nine months of pregnancy, for any reason: it would allow for more late term abortions, even though studies show that a fetus experiences pain at 20 weeks: it would eliminate the law that requires that a bay born alive after an abortion be given adequate health care, even though as many as 5 to 10% of babies in late term abortions are born alive; it would permit non-doctors to do abortions, which would endanger the health of women; and it would eliminate all carinal penalties for abortions, so – even if an abortion was against a mother's will (involuntary or coerced), or if an unborn child is deliberately targeted for an act of violence, it could not be prosecuted. New York State already has far too many abortions. We don't need broader abortion laws. We need our law to respect human life at all stages.

This is particularly dangerous, because the law requires a budget to be passed by April 1. Please contact your state legislators to oppose this extreme bill.
