

As I wrote in the last bulletin article, it is virtually impossible for any human person not to experience stress and anxiety to some degree. The human heart is fragile and vulnerable over many things. Mostly, the human heart can be wounded, heavy, stressful, and anxious. As a result there are many people who are lonely, depressed, anxious, and are never genuinely happy. Even those who have faith in God's providence do cope with daily anxieties that are triggered by advanced age, poor health, family strife, crime, economic pressures, and other problems.

Some Christians do have the opinion that anxiety results from not having enough faith and trust in the plan and divine providence of God. Some believe that by relying on God in faith and trusting His plans, one can be able to control one's nervousness and anxious mind. Sometimes we hear certain Christians have the opinion that states, "Real Christians don't struggle with anxiety." But, ancient history tells us that the servants of God faced fears and worries. In Holy Scriptures we do not come across much insight that teaches that lack of faith is the cause of all anxiety. There are examples from the Hebrew Scriptures about faithful worshippers who became very anxious at times. Moses, Hannah, David, and Prophet Elijah, Habakkuk and other men and women of strong faith expressed anxieties (Exodus 4:10; 1 Samuel 1:6; Psalm 55:5; Habakkuk 1:2). Then, in the New Testament, St. Joseph (Matthew 1: 18-24), the apostle Paul (2 Corinthians 11:28) are among other various personalities whose anxiety built in the course of figuring out and responding to the mysterious plans of God. Probably, not having a clue about what could occur in the plan of God could have raised their anxiety level. However, God understood their emotional struggles, nervousness, and anxious feelings. He showed compassion to them and through the power of His grace continued to use them in His service. This is a manifestation of God's understanding of imperfections of humanity due to their brokenness and woundedness because of original sin.

And so, saintly and God fearing people in the past and faithful Christians at present cope with daily anxieties that are triggered by pressures of life. Their stories testify that having faith does not protect us from experiencing difficult emotions. Thus, it appears that it is impossible not to experience anxiety at all. And yet, there should be an entirely different way of understanding, if someone we know suffers from Chronic Anxiety (also referred as Clinical Anxiety), such as Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD), Anxiety Disorders, Substance-Induced Anxiety Disorder, Panic Disorders, Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder, Phobias, Post-traumatic Stress Disorder, Social Anxiety Disorder and other types of anxiety. These clinical anxiety disorders are characterized by constant worry with little cause or no cause. In serious and chronic conditions like these, it is critically essential to get help from professionals, such as psychiatrists, psychologists, and therapists, beside the support and encouragement that will come from their faith.

However, when we are willing to acknowledge about the feelings of anxiety, we may discover that it leading us to a deeper self-understanding and compassion for others. Let's pray for God's grace for wisdom and understanding. Ask the Lord to cleanse us from all unforgiveness, resentment, and bitterness since guilt of sin can block our way to healing. Listen to the Word of God in order to stay positive and build our faith in His divine providence. The Grace of God is available when we are exhausted. His grace is what will give us hope when we feel hopeless, peace when we feel anxious, courage when we feel afraid, and faith when we doubt. For God's grace is a free- gift that we cannot earn.


