Miracles of Jesus

Many people question about the miracles that they can experience through their religious and spiritual beliefs. Belief in miracles may bring many to think a lot about how God works. It seemed like during the period of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and especially, in the New Testament during the time of Jesus, there were a lot of direct divine interventions. Because there are many miraculous events stated in the whole Bible, we can get the impression that miracles and wonders would have occurred in most of the situations. When those who see their life situations in the eyes of faith hearing those extraordinary miraculous interventions, may question, "Why don't we see those kinds of miracles happening today?"

Then, amidst many people's questioning on miracles, a survey done by the *Pew Forum on Religion* records that a vast majority of Americans (almost 80%), believe in miracles. Although it would be natural for people in the 21st century to put their trust in science, it still seems that most people do believe in miracles. A decade ago, the *Harris Poll* (done in November, 2007) found that nearly 8 in 10 American adults believe in miracles. To a greater extent, belief in miracles has connections to personal religious beliefs. Roman Catholics are more likely to believe in miracles more than other believers in other religious faiths. Roman Catholics are more likely to believe that miracles take place through moving, bleeding, and weeping statutes. In Roman Catholic tradition, miracles are normally required for the beatification and canonization of servants of God, such as venerable, blessed, and saint.

What exactly is a miracle? While there are many explanations for what a miracle is, some have described the word "miracle" as an event that occurs outside the bounds of natural law. In that sense, certain miracles may not follow the normal laws of nature and they appear to be events that cannot be explained by the laws of nature. In the case of a miraculous physical recovery, there can be no direct medical or scientific explanations for how and why it occurred.

But, the definition of miracles as "events that appear unexplainable by the laws of nature" does not always reflect the understanding and thoughts of the biblical authors. The biblical authors, in their world view, did not regard the extraordinary miraculous events as necessarily rare. One can argue by stating that nature and its laws are not something that exists and operates independent of God. Thus, miracles are not the only events when God intervenes. It is because God always intervenes in life and in natural world. Rather miracles appear to be events when *God acts differently than usual* for the benefit and redemption of humanity. We also can define miracles as events which are caused by special divine interventions that carry divine messages.

The people in the day of historical Jesus had a chance to witness His firsthand miracles, which were unexplainable scientifically. Some of His miracles appear to occur outside the bounds of the laws of nature; such as activities like; walking on water, turning water into wine, and some of His healings. And yet, they all had beneficial results for those helpless and needy persons who experienced them. Miracles of Jesus were saving acts of God and revealing signs from God.

The vast number of miracles in which Jesus performed demonstrates that they were a regular part of His ministry. During the course of His three-year public ministry, Jesus performed miracles that demonstrated His ability to heal and in performing exorcisms. A major part of the Gospel materials concentrate not on what Jesus says, but on what Jesus does. The four evangelists are unanimous on this point. They record Jesus performing almost about thirty-five separate miracles. Most of the miracles that Jesus performed are recorded in more than one gospel. The miracle of the feeding of the five thousand is recorded in all four gospels. Then again, the author of the Gospel of John states that Jesus performed many more miracles, which are not recorded in the Gospels (John 20:30). Also, Mark in his Gospel indicates that the several miracles of Jesus that he had reported are only a few examples of the healing activity of Jesus (Mark 3:10-11). Jesus performed many miracles not for His own personal advantage, but rather to meet the real needs of the people and to proclaim the values of the kingdom of His Father. Therefore, the message of the miracles of Jesus becomes an important part of them.

Miracles have different and special ways that God intervenes than usual tells us that whatever sufferings, tensions, pains, and troubles we go through. none are too complicated to take to Jesus. We should not feel isolated or alone in our personal problems and helplessness. Jesus through His grace may heal us or offer inspiration to take different approaches towards healing. Even in this postmodern, skeptical, and scientific age, miracles are possible with the grace of God since nothing is impossible to Him.

Updates of Renew & Rebuild

I had the opportunity of speaking at all of the Masses. Again, Renew + Rebuild is a \$200 million archdiocesan campaign aimed at providing financial support to parishes to help ensure their growth and sustainability. \$144 million of the funds raised in this campaign will be directed to parishes to address their own local concerns. The Cardinal's Appeal is incorporated into this campaign for this year.

Every parish in the archdiocese will participate in this campaign. Each parish has their own goal. Therefore, parishes all over the archdiocese are given an opportunity to renew and strengthen their ministries and building facilities since the largest portion of the campaign goal (74%) will be given to the parishes. That means from \$653,000 of our assigned goal, 74% will be given to our parish of Infant Saviour and its mission church, Our Lady of Valley. This is a five year campaign, so whatever you pledge, can be paid over a five year period.

Over the last several months we have been meeting with parishioners. I am happy to announce that build the foundation of this campaign by making their sacrificial pledges so generously. The total pledges raised at present are \$312,450.00. We are almost 46% of our assigned goal. 32 families/parishioners have pledged sacrificially towards this campaign. The average gift at this point is around \$10,000.

On behalf of Cardinal Dolan and Infant Saviour parish, I Fr. Niranjan Rodrigo would like to thank all these families and individual parishioners for their presence in the parish and their generous and sacrificial participation in their parish projects. We are so overwhelmed by the generosity of our 32 parishioners/families for their sacrificial gifts. We are also so grateful for all those of you who will be giving.... We pray for your decision....

As we continue to grow as a parish family, it is essential that our facilities be maintained, and that we provide the best possible programs for the children and adults in our parish. Your presence and generosity here in your parish have always helped all of us to grow in Christ.
